ProRider Recalls Bicycle Helmets Due to Risk of Serious Injury or Death by Head Injury

GREENE COUNTY, OH – Greene County Public Health officials are alerting Greene County families of a recall of a common type of bicycle helmet used across the country. If your child has a ProRider Helmet, please check whether it is part of the recall and either dispose of it (or upcycle it into a hanging planter).

These helmets have been recalled because they do not meet the required safety rules. They may not absorb impact well, stay in place, or have the right labels and certification. If there is a crash, the helmet may not protect the rider, which can lead to serious head injuries or even death.

This recall involves ProRider economy, bike helmets with a turn ring, bike helmets with black foam, BMX helmets, and toddler bike helmets. The helmets were sold in the following colors: blue, green, red, black, and purple. The model number, manufacture date in MM/YYYY, and serial number can be found on a label inside the helmet.

How do I know if my helmet is part of the recall?

- Visit the [Consumer Product Safety Commission's website](#) to check the specific models affected.
- All recalled products were produced in the year 2022
- Every helmet has a manufacturer's date inside. After 5 years, helmets deteriorate and should be replaced regardless of any recall.

To receive a replacement helmet, the following is required:

1. Refer to the list of recalled manufacture dates and compare it with the printed manufacture date on the inner label of your helmet.
2. If your helmet matches the exact manufacture date posted in the recall for that specific helmet style, include a picture of the helmet and a picture of the inner label with the manufacturer's date that matches the posted recall dates.
3. The size of the helmet.
4. The address to mail the replacement.
