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New Trail Amenities Coming to Wright Brothers-Huffman Prairie Bikeway

FAIRBORN, OH — Greene County Public Health (GCPH) and the City of Fairborn are adding new features to the Wright Brothers-Huffman Prairie Bikeway. The new features will make the trail more comfortable, useful, and welcoming for walkers, runners, and bikers.

Two new benches and two bike repair stations will be added along the trail in Fairborn.

The benches will give trail users a place to sit, rest, and enjoy the outdoors. The bike repair stations will have basic tools that cyclists can use to make small repairs or adjustments to their bikes.

“Having safe and welcoming places to be active is an important part of a healthy community,” said Kaci Warren, health educator at Greene County Public Health. “These new trail features give people more reasons to get outside, move their bodies, and enjoy time in nature. Simple changes like these can support both physical and mental health.”

Being active can help people stay healthy and lower their risk for many health problems. Spending time outside can also help reduce stress and support mental well-being. Trails also give people a place to spend time with family and friends.

The new benches and bike repair stations are part of an ongoing partnership between GCPH and the City of Fairborn to support the community's health and well-being.

The bike repair stations can also help cyclists with minor problems while using the trail. Having basic tools nearby may help them make a quick repair and continue their ride safely.

Community Invited to Help Clean the Trail

GCPH and Fairborn Parks and Recreation will hold a **Trail Cleanup Day on September 28, 2026**. Community members are invited to volunteer and help keep the Wright Brothers-Huffman Prairie Bikeway clean, safe, and welcoming.

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Volunteers will meet at **9:45 a.m.** in the shopping center parking lot at **Kauffman and Garland Avenue**. Cleanup will begin at **10 a.m.** Volunteers will work along the Wright Brothers-Huffman Prairie Bikeway.

Buckets, grabbers, and water will be provided. Volunteers should come prepared to spend some time outdoors and help care for our community trails.
